Anndreyea Kylo spent 38 years on Vancouver Island where she studied with notable west coast artists working and studying in a variety of mediums including watercolours. Anndreyea contributed to the Pearl Ellis Gallery in Comox, BC and was an active member of the Brushstrokes Art Group. While in BC Anndreyea became a member of the Canadian Federation of Artist.

Moving to Ontario after many years in B.C. was a difficult decision but the interest in the art community in the Belleville and Peterborough area was compelling. Following the success of 2008 she is continuing her role for the 2009 festival.

Anndreyea is a member of the Center Hastings art group in Madoc, and the AIM group in Marmora. Painting is her passion and her past time, and over the past year she has shown her work in Madoc Library and The Marmora Medical Center.

Anndreyea now paints in acrylics and water based oils as well as watercolours. Her newest expression of creativity is the fine art of jewellery making

Anndreyea is a regular in the Market Place both in Madoc and Marmora during the summer months showing her art, and jewellery while some of her paintings are displayed for sale in Marmora's AIM gallery.
